

Dover ready to welcome cruise ships of up to 350m for the first time

The Port of Dover has completed a £6 million plus upgrade to mooring facilities on its two dedicated cruise berths, which will enable some of the largest cruise ships in the world to visit the Kent port in the years to come.

It marks the first step towards a wider expansion of Dover Cruise, which is one of the key elements of the Port's long term vision to 2050.
