Portsmouth International Port has been named Best Port for the second year in a row at the industry renowned Wave Awards – known internationally as the "Oscars for cruise".

Last year (2023) saw Portsmouth win two awards in their first time attending the event, where they were crowned Best Port and Best Environmental Innovation.
